



Above. Second prototype of the Mk 4 variant undergoing trials at FVRDE. This example was converted from a Mk 2/3 probably dating from around 1958. (TMB, 2058 D3)

Top right. Prototype number 5 of the Swingfire-equipped Mk 5 variant undergoing so-called trundling trials during 1967. This is yet another conversion, unfortunately of uncertain parentage. Compare the shape of the stowage bin for the reloadmissiles with those on the mockup shown opposite. (TMB, 2058 C1)

Centre right. This is a Mk 2/3 rigged for amphibious trials by the use of rubberised flotation bags. A metal screen erected around the engine compartment covers helped to prevent the vehicle becoming unstable due to gross leakage at the rear. (TMB, 2802 A3)

Bottom right. Steady as she goes! This is Chertsey development vehicle RGX 870 with polyurethane blocks attached to the hull photographed during amphibious trials; see also page 18. (MBRT/Alvis Ltd)
